Social Identity Model of Collective Action




Figure 1. The social identity model of collective action (van Zomeren, Postmes & Spears, 2008).

RESEARCH GOALS

Establish groups of Croatian citizens different regarding to combination of reported participation in collective actions

separately for Continental and Adriatic Croatia

- Investigate the potential differences between these groups with respect to
 - > strengths of different social identifications
 - levels of concern regarding different groups and issues in Croatian society



METHOD

SAMPLE

N = 1462 Croatian citizens (Croatian nationality - subset of the

European value study data set (EVS, 2020) collected in 2017-2018)

- $M_{\text{age}} = 48.8 \ (SD = 17.7)$
- 59% women
- 37% high income
- 27% from towns with less than 5000 citizens
- 36% from Adriatic Croatia
- 69% did not participate in tertiary education



METHOD – Measures

Collective actions (activism)

- Signing a petition
- Joining in boycotts
- Attending lawful demonstrations
- Joining unofficial strikes

1 = have done,

2 = might do,

3 = would never do



METHOD - Measures

STRENGHTS OF SOCIAL IDENTIFICATIONS

How close do you feel to:

- Town/city
- County/region/district
- Country

1 = very close,

4 = not close at all

- Continent
- World

How proud are you to be a Croat?

1 = very proud,4 = not at all proud

CONCERNS

How much are you concerned with:

- People neighbourhood
- People own region
- Fellow countrymen
- Europeans

1 = very much,

Humankind


4 = not so much

- Elderly people
- Unemployed people
- Immigrants
- Sick and disabled



RESULTS Latent class analyses- 3 classes


Adriatic Croatia (HR03)

Continental Croatia (HR04)






RESULTS LCA on the pooled sample





LEVEL OF CONCERN for DIFFERENT GROUPS/ISSUES



CONCLUSIONS

THREE LATENT CLASES

Negligible differences between Adriatic and Continental Croatia

STRENGHTS of SOCIAL IDENTIFICATIONS

- Activists and non-activists feel similarly attached to broader group(s) covered by this study
- Activists reported lower national pride compared to nonactivists

LEVEL of CONCERNS

- Activists (and would-be activists) more concerned about different groups and issues
- Politicized identity being more relevant for collective actions compared to strength of broader social identifications

LIMITATIONS

- Cross-sectional research design
- Limited number of activism items used as indicators
- Measurement scale
- Concern as a measure of politized identity?
